# What Is Recycling?

Recycling is how we take trash and transform it into new products. There are several types of recycling processes that allow some materials to be used one or more times. Recycling is good for us and the environment because it reduces the use of new raw materials to produce new products. It also reduces the energy we use, improves the quality of air and water, and fights climate change.

All sorts of things can be recycled. Some of the most common processes used today recycle:

- Plastics
- Glass
- Metals
- Electronics
- Computers and accessories
- Textiles
- Newspapers and magazines
- Cardboard

Soda cans, plastic water bottles, plastic milk cartons, newspapers, cereal boxes and old computers are just some of the common items that are recycled every day. If all of us were to recycle just a few items per day that we throw away, we can go a long way to improving the environment for our futures and future generations.

## Household Hazardous Waste



In 2024, the BCUA conducted eight, one-day household hazardous waste (HHW) management events. These events were held at three different locations throughout Bergen County. In all, 11,624 Bergen County households took advantage of these events to dispose of 1,108,639 pounds of unwanted hazardous waste materials. These events continue to be the largest attended one-day events in the State of New Jersey.

This popular BCUA program continues this year. All collections are free, but they are open to Bergen County residents only (proof of residency required). At these HHW drop-offs, we will accept a wide range of chemicals used in and around your home. Please keep all items in their original, labeled containers and store them out of reach of children and pets.

No containers, including gasoline and motor oil containers, will be returned, so please plan accordingly. We no longer accept alkaline batteries at the HHW events. Common household batteries with "alkaline" on the label are not classified as hazardous waste and can be safely thrown out in the regular garbage. Also, no computers, electronics, confidential paper, commercial waste or tires will be accepted at these events.

# Take Charge of Battery Recycling

Batteries power many of our electronics but once they no longer work, it's important to dispose of them properly. Single-use and rechargeable batteries contain chemicals, plastic and heavy metals. When disposed of improperly, the components in these batteries can sometimes cause fires.



## Battery storage

When storing your batteries, keep them in a safe, dry place and out of the reach of children. Use sealable plastic bags or a plastic container with a lid. For an extra measure of safety, place tape over the battery ends. If a battery is damaged or leaking, immediately place the leaking battery into a sealable plastic bag and isolate from other batteries. Wear protective gloves when handling damaged batteries and wash your hands.

## Remember that certain batteries NEVER go in your trash or recycling bins.

If placed in trash or recycling bins, they can cause fires and put waste and sanitation workers in danger. Batteries can also release toxic chemicals into our soil, air and water. Taking the right steps to dispose and recycle batteries is a win for our health, environment and community.

## Mobile Paper Shredding

Residents may deliver their confidential paper documents to various locations and observe as their documents are shredded on site. Acceptable documents are limited to confidential and sensitive materials only. Non-confidential materials, such as books, magazines, and newspapers, should be recycled through your local municipal recycling program and will not be accepted. You do not have to remove paper clips, staples, or paperboard binder covers. To accommodate all of those wishing to participate, there is a limit of four (4) bags or boxes of documents weighing no more than 10 pounds each.



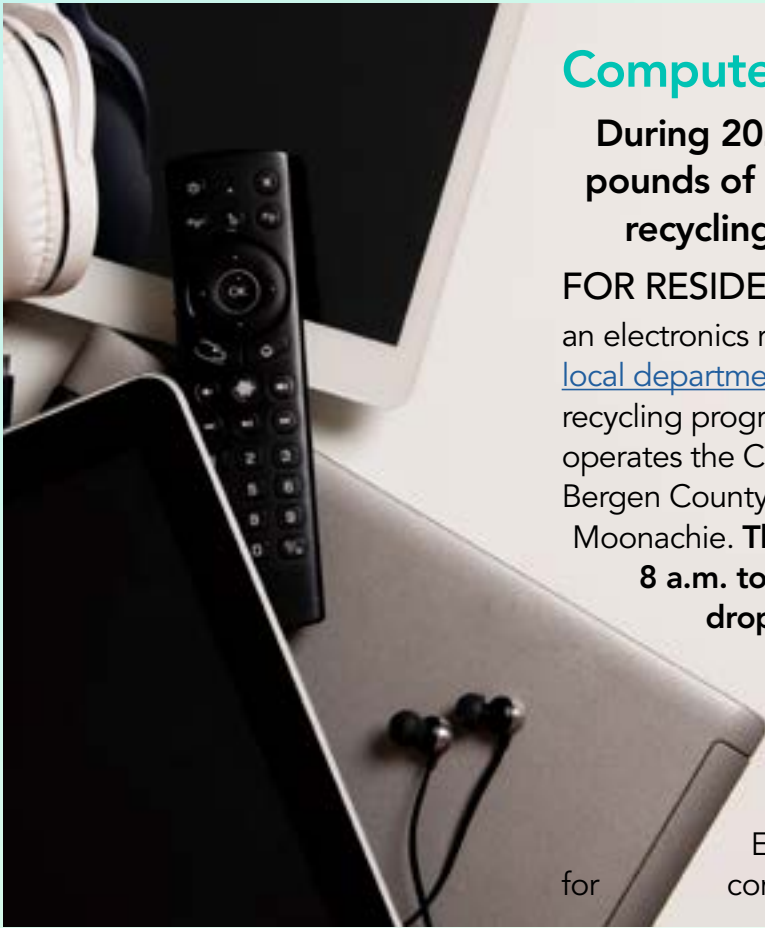
The BCUA offers each municipality the opportunity to host a collection event at a municipal site of its choice. In addition, the BCUA sponsors four one-day collection events at two locations in Bergen County. In 2024, 65 municipalities opted to participate in this program and the BCUA hosted four county-wide collection events. Through these programs, the BCUA collected a total of 494,278 pounds of confidential paper for destruction and recycling. For more information click [here](#) or visit the [DPW contact list](#).

## Tire Recycling

Since 1995, the BCUA has sponsored a Municipal Tire Recycling Program. With over 240 million tires being discarded every year, tires take up large amounts of landfill space unnecessarily and present an adverse environmental impact on our solid waste stream.

**During 2024, the BCUA collected 1,563 tires  
from Bergen County residents for recycling.**

**FOR RESIDENTS:** The BCUA hosts four (4) one-day drop-off events for tire recycling. There is a limit of four tires per participant. Tires with or without rims will be accepted. These events are for Bergen County residents only (no businesses). For more information click [here](#).



## Computers and Electronics

During 2024 the **BCUA collected 69,381 pounds of computer and electronic equipment for recycling from both residents and businesses.**

**FOR RESIDENTS:** Many Bergen County municipalities offer an electronics recycling program so we ask that you contact [your local department](#) of Public Works first to see if an electronics recycling program exists in your municipality. The BCUA operates the Computer and Electronics Recycling Depot for all Bergen County residents at the BCUA, Foot of Empire Blvd., Moonachie. **This depot is open Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. The BCUA also hosts 4 (four) one-day drop-off events for Bergen County residents only (no businesses).**

**FOR BUSINESSES:** The Computer and Electronics Recycling Depot accepts equipment from businesses. Contact the BCUA Environmental Programs Hotline at 201-807-5825 for complete details.

## Commercial, Institutional and Industrial

## Recycle Right!

Only recycle what is acceptable in your municipality. Be careful to follow the recycling guidelines as advertised by your local area. Guidelines provide specific details about the materials that are and are not acceptable. If you put it in the recycling bin and it's not in the guidelines it becomes garbage. Another useful tip – Don't bag recyclables.

You may ask yourself why have the rules for recycling changed? The fact is the "rules" for recycling have not changed significantly. The end market specifications for recycled materials have tightened so non-recyclable items in your curbside container have become a bigger problem for facilities that separate and process what you place in that container. The fact is that these non-recyclable items were never supposed to be placed in your recycling container. For this reason, Bergen County and its municipalities have stepped up their education efforts to keep these items out of the recycling stream.

Unacceptable materials increase the cost of operation and lower the value of recyclables. Visit your local municipal website for guidance.

## BCUA Back Yard Composting Program

Composting food scraps along with yard waste not only reduces the amount of waste going to landfills, the process also produces organic material that can be used to enrich garden soil.

There are many different types of backyard compost bins available; from the simple handmade type to the multiple pre-made ones available. All will work if you follow the proper procedures.



- Place your compost bin on bare soil
- Keep the material moist, like a wrung-out sponge
- Allow it to get air - stir or turn over regularly
- Add a variety of materials
- Cover added kitchen waste with brown material such as leaves

### MOBILE PAPER SHREDDING



**Give your paper a safe retirement – shred it!**

Recycle your confidential documents such as, bills, receipts, tax returns, medical records, legal documents, etc. safely by shredding them. (Recycle magazines and non-confidential paper at curbside.)

**In an effort to accommodate everyone, there is a limit of four (4) bags/boxes, weighing no more than 10 lbs. each.**

Paper clips and staples are acceptable. Please remove binder clips.

Shredding performed immediately on-site.

*\*\*\*Shredding program will end prior to 2pm in the event the shredding trucks reach capacity.*

### ELECTRONICS & COMPUTERS



**Recycle one “byte” at a time – bring us your electronics and computers!**

Recycle laptops, monitors, cables, wires, speakers, computers, televisions, stereos, printers, and more!

### TIRE RECYCLING



**Give your tires one last spin – recycle them!**

Four (4) tire limit, per delivery. Tires with or without rims accepted.

### UNWANTED MEDICATION



Discard your unwanted and expired over-the-counter and prescription medications in a secured Project Medicine Drop box.

Bring medication in original containers or a sealed bag. **Sharps and liquids will not be accepted.**

You can also dispose of unused and expired medications anonymously, seven days a week, 365 days a year, at “prescription drug drop boxes” located within the headquarters of participating police departments. ## **Directions to BERGEN COMMUNITY COLLEGE 400 Paramus Rd., Paramus (Entry via Paramus Rd. ONLY)**

### ***From the North (via Route 17)***

Turn right off Route 17 South onto Ridgewood Avenue (West) to Paramus Road. Turn left onto Paramus Road and continue approximately two miles to college; proceed around jug handle to main entrance.

### ***From the East***

Take Route 4 West to Paramus Road (Paramus Road is  $\frac{3}{4}$  miles past Route 17 intersection.) Turn right onto Paramus Road and proceed north approximately two miles to Bergen Community College entrance on right.

### ***From the South (via Route 17)***

Take Route 17 North to Century Road exit, second exit to the right, proceed around cloverleaf over Route 17 onto Century Road (West). Continue to Paramus Road and turn right onto Paramus Road to college entrance on right.

### ***From the West***

Take Route 4 East to Paramus Road (exit under overpass). Turn right onto Paramus Road and proceed north for approximately two miles to college entrance on right.

## **Directions to BERGEN COUNTY CAMPGAW MOUNTAIN RESERVATION 200 Campgaw Rd., Mahwah (Ski Area)**

### ***Traveling Route 17 North***

Take Route 202 (Morristown/Suffern) exit. Make left at stop sign. Pass Ramapo College on left. Make left onto Darlington Avenue; bear right at fork onto Campgaw Road. The Reservation is approximately 1.5 miles on the right.

### ***Traveling Route 208 West***

Take Rt. 202/Ramapo Valley Road North. Right onto Darlington Avenue, bear right at fork onto Campgaw Road. The Reservation is on the right.

- Mercury Switches
- Oil Filters (used)
- Paints & Varnishes - All Types
- Pesticides
- Photographic Chemicals
- Propane Gas Cylinders (1 lb. and 20 lb. only)
- Solvents & Thinners
- Thermostats
- Thermometers
- Used Motor Oil

## UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS FOR WASTE COLLECTIONS

- Any business or commercial generated waste
- Empty containers or hardened paint cans are garbage
- Alkaline batteries (AA, AAA, C, D, 9V) dispose in normal trash
- Unlabeled waste or containers with unknown contents
- Regulated medical waste, sharps, radioactive materials, and explosives
- Containers larger than five (5) gallons
- Any compressed cylinders (e.g. oxygen or acetylene)
- Pressure-treated lumber or railroad ties
- Computers, electronics, and tires are NOT accepted at waste collections.
- Smoke Detectors
- Construction/demolition debris

### Directions to BERGEN COMMUNITY COLLEGE: 400 Paramus Rd., Paramus, NJ (Entry via Paramus Rd. ONLY)

#### **From the North (via Route 17)**

Turn right off Route 17 South onto Ridgewood Avenue (West) to Paramus Road. Turn left onto Paramus Road and continue approximately two miles to college; proceed around jug handle to main entrance.

#### **From the East**

Take Route 4 West to Paramus Road (Paramus Road is ¾ miles past Route 17 intersection.) Turn right onto Paramus Road and proceed north approximately two miles to Bergen Community College entrance on right.

#### **From the South (via Route 17)**

Take Route 17 North to Century Road exit, second exit to the right, proceed around cloverleaf over Route 17 onto Century Road (West). Continue to Paramus Road and turn right onto Paramus Road to college entrance on right.

#### **From the West**

Take Route 4 East to Paramus Road (exit under overpass). Turn right onto Paramus Road and proceed north for approximately two miles to college entrance on right.

### Directions to BERGEN COUNTY UTILITIES AUTHORITY: Foot of Empire Blvd., Moonachie, NJ (Entry via Empire Blvd., Moonachie ONLY. NO entry via Mehrhof Rd., Little Ferry)

#### **Traveling Route 17 North**

Exit at Moonachie/Wood-Ridge exit. Make right at light onto Moonachie Ave. Pass Teterboro Airport (on your left) and continue going straight until road ends into BCUA facilities.

#### **Traveling Route 17 South**

Exit at Moonachie/Wood-Ridge exit. (Exit is by The Fiesta.) Make left at light onto Moonachie Avenue. Pass Teterboro Airport (on your left) and continue going straight until road ends into BCUA facilities.

#### **Traveling Route 17 North**

Take Route 202 (Morristown/Suffern) exit. Make left at stop sign. Pass Ramapo College on left. Make left onto Darlington Avenue; bear right at fork onto Campgaw Road. The Reservation is approximately 1.5 miles on the right.

#### **Traveling Route 208 West**

Take Rt. 202/Ramapo Valley Road North. Right onto Darlington Avenue, bear right at fork onto Campgaw Road. The Reservation is on the right.
